



**Coalition to Save Lake Winnipeg
News Update
November 26, 2021**

The Province of Manitoba announced that it will support the City of Winnipeg's application for infrastructure funding from the Federal Government's Canada Infrastructure Program. The funding application includes support for the second phase of the North End Water Pollution Control Center (NEWPCC) upgrades. Premier Heather Stefanson also announced that the City of Winnipeg was no longer required to pursue a public-private partnership model for the Phase 2 Biosolids Facilities.

The Ministry of Transport and Infrastructure, Government of Canada represented by the Honorable Dominic LeBlanc, will receive the funding application from the City of Winnipeg and Province of Manitoba.

While the funding that is potentially available from the Canada Infrastructure Program is essential for moving forward to complete Phase 2 of the NEWPCC upgrades, at this time, the timeline for NEWPCC compliance with the environmental regulations of .01 mg/l of phosphorus emissions remains unchanged. Completion of the project continues to be estimated at 2032.
