Over the next few weeks Lake Winnipeg Concerned Citizens can request from their candidates their commitment to best practice decision making for the health of Lake Winnipeg. Our individual choice on the ballot is part of the process of building a healthy and sustainable Lake Winnipeg.

What solutions do you propose for zebra mussel clean up on the beaches? How will you work together with the Provincial and Federal Governments for resolutions to this challenge?

How will you advocate for wetland protection in your municipality?

How will you actively support and work for a moratorium on the drainage of marshes?
